

Each week on Friday, your child will receive homework. Each week there will be spellings to learn, a maths activity (linked to what we are learning in class) reading, and writing or SPaG activity. Homework must be completed each week by Wednesday.

It is vital that your child completes homework, the homework will help them to embed key learning from school and will allow them to develop their independence and routines before they move on to the next part of their journey (Secondary School) where they will need to navigate and manage daily homework.




In our Reading sessions, we will be reading The Boy who Grew Dragons by the wonderful author

In Writing, we will be writing Non-Chronological Reports. This will include: The Bad Guys, Pokemon, Mountain and Angry Birds.






In Computing, we will be focussing on internet safety and looking at what information we should and should not share online.

In Science, we will be learning about digestion and how our body breaks down food and drinks. We will also be looking at food chains and the different types of teeth.



In Grammar, we are looking at different types of sentences, types of nouns, co-ordinating conjunctions and determiners

In Maths, we will be starting our block on place value, which focuses on our understanding of increasingly large numbers. We will also be looking at fractions, decimals and percentages to understand their value.





In History, we will be learning about The Stone Age through to the Iron Age. We will be looking at how these people trade with each other and how technologies developed over these time periods

In PE, we will be starting the year focusing on team games, primarily Football and Cross Country. PE lessons will be on Wednesday and Friday with our sports coach—Mr W.
