

Each week on Friday, your child will receive homework. Each week there will be spellings to learn, a maths activity (linked to what we are learning in class) reading, and writing or SPaG activity. Homework must be completed each week by Wednesday.

It is vital that your child completes homework, the homework will help them to embed key learning from school and will allow them to develop their independence and routines before they move on to the next part of their journey (Secondary School) where they will need to navigate and manage daily homework.



Home Reading

Your child has been given a reading record and has taken home a reading book. It is so important that your child reads at home each night and brings their reading record back each day, again this helps children to build a routine ready for Secondary School and the expectations around planners.


In our Reading sessions, we will be reading
There's A Boy In The Girls' Bathroom by the famous author Louis Sachar. We will also be reading a variety of
non-fiction texts.





In Writing we will be writing explanation texts.
This will include, How to Create the Ultimate
Sundae, How to Sneak Your Monster into
School and How to survive on a Desert Island.

In Grammar, we are looking at different types of sentences, word classes, conjunctions, phrases and clauses. In Maths, we will be starting our block on place value, which focuses on our understanding of increasingly large numbers. We will also be looking at fractions, decimals and percentages to understand their value.





In History, we will be learning about the Ancient Greece. We will be looking at their civilisations, their culture and the ancient empire that they created.

In PE, we will be starting the year focusing on team games, primarily Football and Cross Country. PE lessons will be on a **Friday** with our sports coach—Mr W.
